So - What should you expect when you come to Church?

Let's walk through from arrival at the building.....

When you arrive at church, you may find a queue just like the co-op!

We will be using the **old side door** rather than the usual main door. This gives us more room inside where you will be welcomed by a small team of people.

The "usual" door at the back of the church is for emergency exit only.

There are various notices as you come in through the vestibule, so please take a little time to read them.

Masks must be worn in the building and we do have some available on the vestibule noticeboard if you forget yours.

Sanitiser is available at the entrance for use on entering and leaving.

We are also required to note down your name and contact number for Track and Trace. Kay will be doing this.

You will see that the seating layout is not as it used to be.

We must allow 2m social distancing in every direction between all the seats so the seating capacity is now 30 which is a lot less than we are used to.

A member of the welcoming group will help show you where to sit. The pews can accommodate two people – one at either end – there are markers at each place.

A couple or a family may sit together in one pew.

It makes sense to begin filling up seats from the back and working forward as this avoids passing people already seated.

Some questions and answers –

Q. Can we sing?

A. Unfortunately we are not allowed to sing at the moment.

Q. Can we use the balcony?

A. It is not possible to use the balcony at the moment.

Q. Is the toilet going to be available?

A. Yes it will be. Please use sanitiser before entering.

Q. How will I make my offering?

A. There will be a collection plate near the entrance.

Q. What if I don't feel able to come to church – can I make my offering some other way?

A. Yes, there are several ways to do this.
